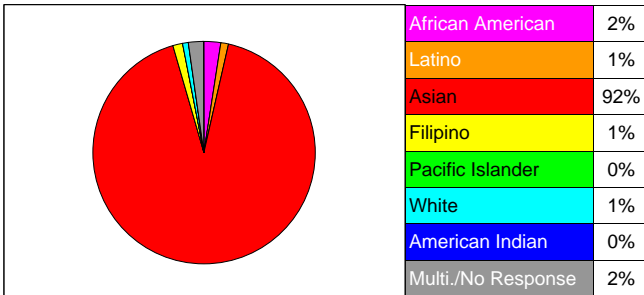

A large percentage of the student population comes from homes where a language other than English is spoken. The largest number of English Learners speak Cantonese. Lincoln School receives Title I funding, but despite the parents' income level and second-language needs, Lincoln School enjoys high academic test results with Academic Performance Index (API) scores progressing from 821 in 2001 and most recently to 933 in 2009. It has met the Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) criteria for all components: participation rate, percent proficient, and API goals. Lincoln has a high redesignation rate with 34.6% of the students progressing from Limited to Fluent English Proficiency. Students and families have a long tradition of recognizing the importance of school, and that is reflected in the outstanding attendance rate: as high as 98% in 2009.
